On Saturday, August 13, several Club members met at the Pollinator and Enabling Gardens – PEG – to discuss and plan for this Club project. Karen Marzonie will head up the PEG study group. It was decided we will use the remainder of summer and fall to clean up the areas and the coming winter to plan in more detail how we'll go forward. Nick Speth, Manager of Gardens & Grounds and Horticulturalist at the Fair Lane Estate, will work to remove some of the horsemint that has expanded exponentially. The weeds in the pathways are being addressed to aid in the work to be done. A general goal is to have a 60/40 mix of native and non-native plants in each area.

The PEG study group members met again on Friday, August 26 at the gardens. Karen Marzonie arranged for Rick Simek, Program Supervisor and Manager of the Natural Areas at UM-Dearborn to join us. Rick offered some guidance as to what is an "aggressive" versus an "invasive" plant. Karen brought Nick Speth, Manager of Gardens and Grounds at Fair Lane, as well as Jenna Purvins and Slater Stanton, Environmental Sciences students at UM-D. Several different plants were identified and discussed. Nick, Jenna, and Slater made great progress in cleaning up the pollinator area. Nick cleared out dead plant material, Jenna dug out buckthorn, and Slater dug out teasel. And great news – they discovered three tiny black swallowtail caterpillars while working. Friday, August 12th was Maryanne Bartles last day of work as Library Director of Dearborn Public Libraries before starting her long deserved retirement. A planter was sent to Maryanne on behalf of the Garden Club of Dearborn to wish her well. Maryanne pointed out that in 1919 the women of the Garden Club conceived the idea for a public library in what was then Dearborn Township. Their vision was realized in 1924 with the opening of the new library called Mason Branch Library (now Bryant), and it remained Dearborn's main library until Henry Ford Centennial Library opened in 1969. Looking ahead, our speaker for our meeting on October 11 at 6:00pm at the First Presbyterian Church - will be Cheryl English of Black Cat Pottery. Cheryl is an Advanced Master Gardener, artist, writer, and educator. She will talk about gardening for birds. She'll bring some of her lovely pottery to display and sell.
