The following information is provided to us by Mary Laundroche of the City of Dearborn.

<u>Bagged leaf collection program to end week of December 12-16. Final days of loose leaf</u> collection November 28-December 2.

The last days for collection of loose leaves raked into the street is on trash days the week of November 28-December 2, with the program ending in the Friday trash district on December 2. Leaves should no longer be raked into the street after your trash day this week.

However, leaves and yard waste will still be collected in bags or approved containers set at the easement through the week of December 12-16. After a neighborhood's last pickup of bagged and containerized leaves the week of December 12-16, the city's trash contractor will not pick up any yard waste until March 2023. Questions about the yard waste collection program, including bagged or containerized leaves, can be directed to 313-943-2150.

If residents still have yard waste or bagged leaves to dispose of both collection programs end, they can drop it off at the DPW yard on the third Saturday of each month. The next scheduled DPW yard day is Saturday, December 17 from 8 a.m. – 1 p.m. The yard is at 2951 Greenfield. Loose leaf collection is a great service in our community, helping keep our neighborhoods looking their best.
